ACHIEVEMENT

In 2020, 91% of all student entries were graded A*–C. The college also secured a 100% pass rate in all A-Level and vocational courses for the seventh time, reflecting the high academic rigour that is expected.

On average, a grade B was achieved by students on A-Level courses in 2020 (firmly above the national average) and a Distinction (equivalent to a grade A) was achieved by students on vocational courses.

Moreover, every student who wished to continue into higher education secured a university place.

Ofsted stated that sixth form provision was good with good leadership and management enabling students to achieve good outcomes.

ETHOS

Our ethos ‘*Sapere Aude*’ translates to ‘*Dare to Know*’ and serves as a challenge to our students to be inquisitive and to explore wider knowledge in their curriculum subject areas and beyond. We expect the Toot Hill Sixth Form learner to embrace their Key Stage 5 studies through a diligent work ethic and a thirst for knowledge. We engage our students through an expertly designed, ambitious curriculum and high quality teaching and mentoring aimed to develop autonomously motivated lifelong learners.

Our curriculum provides varied opportunities to collaborate, think critically and engage with wider reading and research to deepen knowledge and understanding. Our learners are encouraged to ask as many questions as they answer, actively listening and responding with a discerning sense of purpose.

Alongside their academic studies, we are proud to provide students with a carefully designed, age appropriate Personal Development Curriculum which develops core values such as integrity and empathy in order to develop our students into well rounded and active global citizens. Every student, through our commitment to ‘Leave your Legacy’, is encouraged to consider their impact upon others, the college and the wider community.

Toot Hill students appreciate the importance of empathy, kindness and thoughtfulness—they respect a wide range of diverse perspectives and viewpoints and are encouraged to share these views in their vertical mentor groups which combine Year 12 and 13 with similar subject interests. Our aim is to foster in every young person a willingness to invest in their own and others’ intellectual, social and personal growth.

Students at Toot Hill Sixth Form College are offered a wide range of wider enrichment opportunities through our ‘extra-curricular and academic extras’ programmes, including EPQ, Core Maths, organising community projects and charitable events, leadership positions within the Student Union, membership of Subject Societies, The People’s Society, university visits and work experience.

Our destinations programme ensures all students are offered personalised support throughout their Key Stage 5 studies, including applying for undergraduate course at university through UCAS, and the increasingly popular degree apprenticeship pathway.



ENRICHMENT

Duke of Edinburgh's Award (D of E)

This provides you with the opportunity to try new activities, develop key life skills and contribute to the local community through the 'volunteering' section. You will complete the final assessment by planning and completing, as a team, a fully self-sufficient expedition in the Peak District.

Travelteer Expedition

You will complete a two-week expedition abroad as a team, including a community project, a challenging trek and a sight-seeing element. Previous trips have taken place to Morocco, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Romania. This is the ultimate opportunity for you to respond to mental and physical challenges that will enable you to develop skills and gain experiences that will stay with you for life.

Students' Union (Senior Prefects)

An active Students' Union enables greater autonomy for students in the creation of a 'higher education' ethos and provides opportunities for consultation regarding key college decisions. Sub-committees take responsibility for key college foci including events (such as the annual Christmas Party and College Summer Ball), teaching and learning facilities, links with the lower school and the college newsletter.

Work Experience

You will be encouraged to find a placement which supports your interests and career aspirations. Work experience takes place at the end of Year 12 and helps you develop additional experience in support of your UCAS application.



Engineering Education Scheme

This scheme links Year 12 students with a local STEM business to work on real-life scientific, engineering and technical problems. Over the course of a six-month programme, you will get the opportunity to complete your British Association Crest Award.

Young Enterprise

A national competition where you form a company to design, create, advertise and sell a product or service to be showcased at local and regional events with support from business leaders in the local community.

Community Sports Leadership Award

An engaging and practical experience that enables you to develop leadership, communication, organisation and teamwork skills through the planning and leading of sports festivals for local primary school children.

Toot Hill Sixth Form College Passport

A unique Toot Hill Sixth Form College programme that accredits you for 100 hours of volunteering in the school and local community. You are provided with opportunities to volunteer in subject curriculum classes or after-school clubs, work with individual pupils through learning support or become an Arts Academy mentor working with pupils from local primary schools.

Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)

Well-respected and recommended by top universities, Year 13 students are offered the opportunity to research and write a 5,000-word project on a topic of their choice. You will be provided with a mentor who offers one-to-one support and advice and you will complete the final assessment by presenting your findings to senior members of staff in college.

FACILITIES

Based in the Suthers Building, which opened in 2014, Toot Hill Sixth Form College has an excellent range of facilities available to students.

COLLEGE MENTOR PROGRAMME

Toot Hill Sixth Form College provides a dedicated mentoring programme.

Each student is assigned a dedicated mentor during their time at Toot Hill Sixth Form College.

In Year 12, the mentor programme incorporates:

- Study skills to help GCSE to A-Level transition
- Student well-being
- Dedicated one-to-one interviews
- Clear and transparent target setting
- Career pathways
- Revision and study support

ADVICE AND CHOOSING THE RIGHT SUBJECTS

Students will select three courses to study from the beginning of Year 12, which they will continue throughout the duration of their two years at Toot Hill Sixth Form College.

All courses that we offer are graded as ‘Level 3’ qualifications by Ofqual, which means they are all of equal difficulty and accepted equally by the majority of universities, apprenticeship and employment opportunities.

Students have the choice of selecting any combination of three A-Levels, which tend to be more heavily exam-based in their assessment, and/or vocational qualifications such as BTEC or Technical Level qualifications, which have a greater proportion of coursework as part of their assessment.

In addition, some students may wish deliberately to select a greater number of ‘facilitating subjects’ as their A-Level choices; these are

A-Level courses that have been specifically recommended by some top universities and include English Literature, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, History, Geography, French, German and Spanish.

HOW TO APPLY

The application cycle for students wishing to study at Toot Hill Sixth Form College from next September onwards opens on Thursday 12 November 2020. The final deadline for receiving applications will be on Friday 15 January 2021. Nevertheless, we advise applying as early as possible as places may fill up quickly.

In order to complete the online application form, you will need to supply:

- **Your personal and contact details**
- **Your current school details**
- **Your GCSE predicted grades**
- **A personal statement detailing why you are applying to Toot Hill Sixth Form College**
- **Your provisional course choices**

Once we have received your online application, if successful you will be invited to interview during the spring term.

Entry requirements

Toot Hill Sixth Form College has general entry requirements which all students must meet in order to study here. The general college entry requirements are a grade 4 in GCSE English Language and a grade 4 in GCSE Mathematics.

There are also course-specific entry requirements which you must meet in order to study particular courses.

In order to study an A-Level course, you must achieve a grade 5 or above in a relevant GCSE subject(s). In order to study a vocational course, you are recommended to have achieved a grade 4 or above in a relevant GCSE subject(s).
